


A BRIEF OVERVIEW OFTHE CENTRE

Overview: SV & CB Teams

Sexual Violence Team The Sexual Violence Against Male Gender Team (SV team) falls under the Justice and Human Rights' cluster. It examines the issue of the Sexual Violence against the male gender in situations during and post armed conflicts. The Sexual Violence Team builds on international efforts to raise awareness of the use of sexual violence in conflict as a tool of war. Specifically, where there are male victims as they are currently often overlooked in legal remedy.

Capacity Building, as a strategy, forms the backbone of most of the CAJPHR's initiatives as it revolves around peace, justice and human rights. The Legal Capacity Building team (CB team) concentrates on the employment of strategies through training of justice legal actors to constructively engage and involve, in a positive manner, stakeholders in Africa in International Criminal Law. As expected, capacity building falls under the justice cluster of the team's projects.

Right to Quality Education Team


The Right to Quality Education Team falls under Human Rights' cluster. Together with partners, the team works with African stakeholders to provide essential school facilities for students in impoverished communities. The Right to Quality Education Team supports communities to ensure a safe educational environment for all students that is non-violent and inclusive which removes barriers to effective learning.

The Women Empowerment team empowers African women who are disillusioned or helpless, to the point it manifests incapacity to achieve their life/career goals. The team aims at providing women with tools to "Renew themselves, Restate their goals, Re-brand their lives and Re-tell their stories". The women empowerment team is about building female agents of peace, and its objective is to rekindle the spirit of excellence in the minds of women who have been victims of abuse and may be struggling in their lives.

Assets

As a result of the pandemic, Centre for African Justices, Peace and Human Rights' members worked mostly remote and our main focus was to promote justice, peace and human right through online campaigns & events.

This way, there was no investments in fixed assets in 2020, thus, Centre for African Justice, Peace and Human Rights kept the same amount as last year (2019) minus depreciation*. Nevertheless, we successfully hosted our 3rd Annual Conference on Sexual Violence Against the Male Gender: The Case of Child Soldiers, in a physical environment in February (before the pandemic).

Due to the investments necessary to host the event, we had a variation on our current assets (when compared to last year).


Income

- Board Members' Contributions








Expenses

Income Statement

Operational Results

The total income for the year 2020 was € 4.761,00, and out of this sum, € 4.191,77 was spent. The net income at the end of the financial year 2020 was € 605,68.

The net income sum will be spent in the execution phase of the Kisoro Project^{*}.

Operational Expenses

88,04% of the income received in 2020 was used to the maintenance of the Centre and to the execution of events and campaigns.


The remaining 11,96% will be used in the execution phase of the Kisoro Project.

Financial Situation

Even with the difficulties imposed by the pandemic of Covid-19, CAJPHR never stopped working hard for the achievement of our goals and for creating a fair Africa under the concepts of peace and human rights.

Even with the impact suffered by limited donations, we were able to surpass the crisis and deliver high quality of work and end the year with a positive outcome.

Before the quarantine, we were able to held the 3rd Annual Conference on Sexual Violence Against the Male Gender, presenting the case of Child Soldiers, and launch the exclusive Sexual Violence Database.

We were able to initiate and reach the final stages of the Legal Capacity Building Book Project, and start a new group project to research about the crimes and brutality of the SARS police in Nigeria.

We were able to partially raise the amount necessary for the implementation of the Kisoro Project, and successfully executed the Second Hand Book Project. Our work was mainly virtual after the situation brought by the Covid-19, and we intensified our online campaigns. The exclusive virtual environment impose some difficulties on the creation of events and realization of projects, but it also reduced our expenses drastically. Due to our online work, we discontinued our rental agreement for the last semester of the year and we no longer had costs related to physical meetings.

Our intense online efforts were compensated and we were able to publish 7 magazines, 9 articles and 242 Social Media publications.

Our online efforts were focused in generating brought to discussion difficulties that must be faced in order to create a better Africa following the principles of Justice, Peace and Human Rights.

Our financial situation ended the year in a stable and comfortable situation. We were able to accomplish great progress with the resources we had, and we have high hopes for the future.
